

## **FY 2012 Final Military Construction/Veterans Affairs**

The Omnibus appropriations bill fully funds all the military construction projects requested in the President's Budget for the State of Hawaii:

## **FY 2012 Final State and Foreign Operations Appropriations**

**East-West Center           \$16.7 million**

**Resources for Visa Processing**—Requires the State Department to reduce wait times for visa applicants in the People's Republic of China, India, and Brazil by hiring a sufficient number of consular officers to conduct the necessary interviews.

**Study Lengthening Chinese Visas**—Requires the Secretary of State to conduct a risk and benefit analysis of extending leisure and business visas and establish a plan for extending current visa lengths provided it does not undermine security.

## **FY 2012 Final Department of Homeland Security Appropriations**

### **Reimbursements to State and Local governments \$7.5 million**

For the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to reimburse costs incurred by State and local governments affected by National Special Security Events, including use of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities for events like the Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation Leaders Meeting hosted in Honolulu, Hawaii.

### **Federal Highway Administration:**

Of the total amount appropriated during the FY2012 cycle, Hawaii will receive an estimated \$162,573,082 from the Department of Transportation to build and refurbish Hawaii highways.

### **Education:**

Native Hawaiian Education - \$34.2 Million,

The purpose of this program is to develop innovative education programs to assist Native Hawaiians and to supplement and expand programs and authorities in the area of education.

Strengthening Alaska Native and Native Hawaiian-Serving Institutions (Higher education) - \$12.8 Million + \$15 M mandatory funding. This program helps eligible institutions of higher education increase their self-sufficiency and expand their capacity to serve low-income students by providing funds to improve and strengthen the academic quality, institutional management, and fiscal stability of eligible institutions.

### **Treasury:**

Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) Fund - \$12 Million set aside for Native (including Hawaiian) and Small and Emerging CDFIs. The CDFI Fund provides grants, loans, equity investments, and technical assistance, on a competitive basis, to new and existing CDFIs such as community development banks, community development credit unions, and housing and microenterprise loan funds. Recipients use the funds to support mortgage, small business and economic development lending in underserved and distressed neighborhoods and to support the availability of financial services in these neighborhoods.

### **Healthcare:**

\$14,421,000 for Native Hawaiian Healthcare programs

\$1,964,000 for Kalaupapa Hansen's Disease Program

**U.S. Army Corps of Engineers:**

\$2,766,000 to cover Army Corps projects at Barbers Point, Ala Wai Canal, and Nawiliwili Harbor.

**Kukaiua Koa Forest--** There is \$2 million for the Kukaiua Koa Forest project it was number 13 on a priority list of 46. The Forest Legacy program is a key component of the President's America's Great Outdoors initiative to conserve important landscapes. These funds would be used to help protect Kukaiua Koa Forest.

**Volcano National Park**

\$1.5 Million for the National Volcano Early Warning System
